FEDERAL FORMS:

All applicants must have the proper experience to test for the FAA Airframe, Power Plant, or both certifications as evidenced by the FAA authorized 8610-2 Form. This form authorizes the holder to take the FAA written exams as well as the oral and practical exams with an FAA representative. Please bring two original 8610-2 forms for class enrollment. (They must have original signatures, copies not accepted. The forms must be complete and accurate.)

TOOLS, BOOKS, AND CLASSROOM SUPPLIES:

Students are responsible for having all of the required books, tools, and supplies with them and in class as required. Students are fully responsible for NAA tools while in possession of NAA tools. Proper inventory and tool control procedures are required. Students may be subject additional charges, termination, or not allowed to progress if the required items are not obtained or maintained as required and as appropriate.

REFUND POLICY:

I. Refunds for Students Who Withdraw On or Before the First Day of Class:

If tuition and fees are collected in advance of the start date of classes and the student does not begin classes or withdraws on the first day of classes, no more than \$100 of the tuition and fees will be retained by NAA. A refund for a student who does not begin classes will be made within thirty (30) days of the class start date.

II. Refunds for Students Enrolled Prior to Visiting the Institution:

Students who have not visited the school facility prior to enrollment will have the opportunity to withdraw without penalty within three (3) days following either attendance at a scheduled orientation session or following a tour of the facilities and inspection of the equipment.

III. Refunds for Withdrawal Within the First 12 Months:

- 1.) After the first day of classes and during the first 10% of the period of financial obligation, the institution shall refund at least 90% of the tuition;
- 2.) After the first 10% of the period of financial obligation and until the end of the first 25% of the period of obligation, the institution shall refund at least 50% of the tuition;
- 3.) After the first 25% of the period of financial obligation and until the end of the first 50% of the period of obligation, the institution shall refund at least 25% of the tuition; and,
- 4.) After the first 50% of the period of financial obligation, the institution will retain all of the tuition.
- 5.) Withdrawal within the first twelve (12) months releases the student of any financial obligation that extends beyond the 12th month.
